

Amended Partial Action Plan S-2 Fact Sheet

The Lower Manhattan Development Corporation (LMDC) has prepared the following Amended Partial Action Plan S-2 with regard to the \$783 million grant from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for damaged properties and businesses (including the restoration of utility infrastructure) as well as economic revitalization related to the terrorist attacks at the World Trade Center. The LMDC also received a separate \$2 billion federal grant for the World Trade Center disaster recovery and rebuilding efforts administered by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)

On September 29, LMDC issued Amended Partial Action Plan S-2 which proposes to reallocate the funding within the various categories outlined in the Plan. The total funding allocated through S-2, \$750,000,000, remains unchanged. Key components of the Amended Partial Action Plan S-2 are:

- Place all URIR Program Categories on an equivalent and concurrent level of funding priority.
- Cap funding allocations for Emergency and Temporary Service Response (Category One) and Permanent Restoration and Infrastructure Improvements (Category Two) for a combined total amount of \$610 million; including an increase of \$30 million allocated for Category Two to address additional Southern Site eligible costs and extend the deadline for these eligible costs only.
- Revise guidelines for Service Interference (Category Three) to limit eligibility to service interference costs incurred before June 30, 2006.
- Allocate a total of \$40 million for Construction of Carrier Neutral Lateral Conduits
 (Category Four) and Construction of Redundant Fiber Connections to Critical Facilities
 (Category Five); reducing funds for Category Four by \$30 million dollars (reallocated to
 Category Two) and establishing redundant wireless connections as an eligible activity in
 Category Five.
- Modify the program for Mandated Infrastructure Improvements (Category Six) to provide funding exclusively for the WTC Memorial and Memorial Museum, including utilities and electrical and telecommunications systems. This grant shall be made directly to the WTC Memorial Foundation.
- Modify Program Administration to permit the City of New York to utilize the \$4 million allocation for MOSAICS for other planning and administration purposes.
